Copper Valley Telecom is proud to be a participating broadband provider in the temporary Emergency Broadband Benefits program launched by the Federal Communications Commission, which aims to help families struggling to afford internet during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The program provides a discount of up to \$75 per month toward broadband service for eligible Alaskan households. This means that participants could get fiber internet speeds for FREE!

The process is simple, visit getemergencybroadband.org to determine your eligibility and apply for the benefit. Then visit our store or call our customer service department at 800.235.5414 to select the best internet plan for you and inform them of your EBB eligibility. Our technicians will get you set up, and the \$75 credit will be automatically applied to your account every month for the length of the program.

The program will continue until federal funding runs out, or six months after the Department of Health and Human Services declares an end to the COVID-19 health emergency.

Your household qualifies for the Emergency Broadband Benefit if it has an income at or below 135% of the federal poverty guidelines **or** if any member of the household meets one of the requirements below:

- Qualifies for the Lifeline program
- Recieved free and reduced school lunch program benefits during the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 school years
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year
- Experienced a substantial loss of income since February 29, 2020 and the household had a total income in 2020 below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers
- Participates in Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal Head Start (only households meeting the relevant income qualifying standard), Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (Tribal TANF), or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
