CONNECTING COMMUNITIES: 2025 FIBER CONSTRUCTION

CVT is entering another exciting construction season as we continue expanding and enhancing our fiber network in 2025. With multiple major builds planned across our service area, we're pushing forward in our mission to deliver fast, reliable internet to even the most remote corners of Alaska.

The first project to break ground will be along the Glenn Highway, where construction is set to begin on June 1. This Fiber-to-the-Home (FTTH) build will connect 185 locations between milepost 121 and 144, bringing high-speed fiber directly to homes and businesses along this important corridor. As part of this effort, additional backbone fiber will be installed to further strengthen the overall network. Michels has been contracted to complete this project and will begin mobilizing in early June.

Valdez will also see improvements this season. In the downtown area, we'll be replacing sections of aging fiber infrastructure to maintain reliability and improve long-term performance. These upgrades will help ensure that our existing customers continue to receive dependable service while positioning the network for future expansion.

Looking ahead, CVT is actively planning two major future builds through the support of federal ReConnect grants. These projects are


currently undergoing extensive environmental review and permitting, and while construction is not expected to begin until next year, they represent an important step forward in our long-term expansion efforts.

The first of these projects, funded by a 100% Federal ReConnect grant totaling \$17.9 million, CVT will connect 109 locations by extending backbone fiber to the McCarthy Central Office. This project will bring modern connectivity to one of the most isolated areas in our network.

The second project, supported by an additional ReConnect grant (75% funded) totaling \$16.6 million, will connect 45 locations in Ellamar to fiber via the Tatitlek Central Office. Due to the remote location and need for subsea fiber placement, this project is in an extensive planning phase to ensure environmental and logistical challenges are thoroughly addressed before work begins.

Each of these projects represents another step forward in CVT's long-term goal to deliver world-class broadband throughout our region. We're proud to lead the way in connecting our communities and bridging the digital divide—no matter how challenging the terrain.

ANNUAL MEETING RECAP

Copper Valley Telecom held its 2025 Annual Meetings in early May, bringing members from both districts together for an evening of updates, prizes, and community. The events featured a Company Showcase, dinner from Poor Betty's in Valdez and Cast Iron Café in Glennallen, cupcakes from Baked in the Deez, and Alaskan-made sea salt gift sets. More than 40 door prizes were awarded in each district, many donated by CVT vendors.

Staff and board members shared key updates, including the ongoing conversion to the RINA wireless network and the completion of the

dual headend broadband upgrade, which now serves over 80% of members. Those not yet upgraded are encouraged to contact CVT to check eligibility.

In the Valdez District, Ryan Morgan and Jennie Sodergren were elected to three-year terms, and Jessica Vincent was elected to a two-year term. In the Glennallen District, Terry Valentine was elected to a three-year term. The meetings concluded with staff service awards and a look at future initiatives. MAKE YOUR VOTE COUNT

Each year during CVT's Annual Meeting, members submit their votes by mailing in ballots sealed in signed return envelopes. These signatures are reviewed and verified by CVT's Credentials and Elections Committee. For a vote to be counted, the signature on the envelope must match the one we have on file. If it doesn't, the ballot inside—no matter how carefully completed—cannot be validated or counted.

We understand this can be frustrating, and we want to help you avoid common issues that lead to invalid ballots. Here are a few reasons why a signature might not match:

- The return envelope is missing a signature.
- A business representative signs using the business name instead of their own.

- The member has legally changed their name but hasn't updated their CVT membership card.
- The signature has naturally changed over time and no longer matches what we have on record.
- The person who signed the envelope is not the account holder.
 (Please note: authorized users do not have voting rights and cannot submit a valid ballot.)

Every vote matters, and we want your voice to be heard! If you're unsure whether your signature is up to date, or if you've experienced any of the issues above, we encourage you to check in with us ahead of the next Annual Meeting.
